## **Property Committee Fall Announcements**

### **Exterior Brick Refurbishment Project**

Next week Brxton Masonry will repair some of the brick mortar. The Spadina stone and brick archway will be cleaned with specialized equipment. The projected cost is \$20,000. Knox will receive a \$10,000 City of Saskatoon Heritage grant, and \$5,000 will be withdrawn from the Capital Fund. Any additional donations the Congregation can provide to raise the remaining \$5,000 will be greatly appreciated.

### **2019 Interior Renovation Project**

Interior renovations are planned for the Church next year. The floors need to be refinished to preserve the hardwood. The main floor carpet of the Sanctuary also needs to be replaced. Heritage grants are not available for the interior. We will be reaching out to the Congregation and the broader Saskatoon Community for donations this fall.
